

# SOS CHILDREN'S VILLAGE BC SHOCKS PROGRAM CONFERENCE IN BERLIN, GERMANY

Village Director Kistie Singh and I had the wonderful opportunity to attend the SOS Children's Villages EUNA (Europe North America) Program Conference in Berlin. It is a gathering of SOS child development program leaders representing 36 national SOS organizations, and I'm not sure how many individual SOS Villages. In addition to a heady agenda of topics such as "Training professionals working with children in alternative care on child rights: challenges and promising practices", we were able to tour two Villages and an exciting new project.

First the Villages. **SOS Children's Village Berlin-Moabit** is in the heart of Berlin and we would describe it as an enhanced apartment block, containing a full-service cafeteria, meeting rooms, offices, a daycare (with its own children's cafeteria), and of course some apartments.

We also visited **SOS Children's Village Brandenburg**, a wonderful edge-of-rural Village with 8 houses, several apartments, Village Centre, and a daycare. Of personal technical interest to me was that the homes were all radiant floor heated with solar hot water assists. (Yes, I was involved in the solar energy sector at one time.)

And finally an exciting new project, the **Children's Embassy**. A hotel convention facility that will feature a training program for both youth at-risk and youth with physical challenges. Soon to be open, so if you are travelling to Berlin consider booking your stay there.

funded and considered a vital part of every country's structure. An example in Finland: foster homes have a full-time Caregiver caring for 3 to 5 children — much like in BC — however they also have 5 to 7 full-time staff supporting EACH home. Ninety per cent of the funding comes from the government.

Lithuania was in attendance and described their battle to move from the communist-era same age, same sex, orphan warehouses to the exact model that SOS BC is moving towards: professional Caregivers in a foster home structure.

For the most part the European programs are funded and staffed at a level we could only dream of here in BC. And being part of the world's largest child development organization and working in national government-funded social structures within the European Union, they are looking to supplement, add on, or refine their systems. They

are in the heart of a huge system and things are calm and carrying on. The rate of children in care across the EU is approximately 1 child per 1,000.

Then we from SOS Children's Village BC explain our situation, with 8 children per 1,000 in care in our province, the huge percentage of Aboriginal children in out-of-home care, the legacy of insufficient government funding, and the less than 6% government funding that we receive. They were shocked. Then we outlined the plans that our Board, Founders, Staff, and Caregivers have embraced.

With the collective 65+ years of knowledge and experience in child development, and with the support of current leaders of the incredible SOS Kinderdorf programs, we here in BC are going to disrupt the child care system. In the next few years we are going to change the minds, touch the hearts, and inspire the decision makers in and around the foster care sector in BC.
