



SOS Children's Village BC Programs Summary

SOS Village:

15 foster families in Surrey, 17 caregivers, 5 youth in transition, and 52 children

SOS Village – Surrey Campus:

• 5 homes, 5 transition suites, and a Village Community Centre on 2.5 acres

Therapies: Organizational commitment to a trauma-informed approach

- Neurofeedback Training: One-of-a-kind service that optimizes brain function
- **Cognitive Remediation:** An individualized approach to strengthening skills and strategies for learning and comprehension in school, home and social communication
- Expressive Arts: Play Therapy, Art Therapy, Music Therapy, Drama Therapy & Narrative Therapy
- Individual & Family Counselling: Utilizing a variety of groups such as Girls Empowerment, Teen Art Expression, and Child Parent Relationship group

Learning Clubs:

Academic & social support for children in middle school

Sounds of Learning Music Program:

 At local elementary schools group learning of various instruments and choral programs and in our Village Music Studio one-on-one guitar, piano, drum & singing lessons

Camp, Recreation and Cultural Exploration Programs: For children in foster care

- Featuring Cirque Du Soleil SOS Social Circus, Feather outdoor experiential education through Indigenous lens
 Caregiver Support Program:
- Individual & group support for foster parents caring for vulnerable children

Youth Programming:

- Transition to Adulthood: Support services for youth aged 16-24 to gain independent life skills
- Youth Housing Year Intensive: Live-in program utilizing transition suites at the Surrey Campus
- Aftercare: Our commitment to permanency, the program is a life-long engagement for SOS youth

Fee-For-Service Programs:

 Parent Driven Autism Services: A new approach for children and youth aged 6-19; flexible and individualized private services

SOS BC does not receive federal funding. Support services for families living in the Village are partially funded through Vancouver Aboriginal Child and Family Services (VACFSS) and a grant from BC Community Gaming. Our programs are funded through our earned revenue activities, events, corporate/community/foundation grants, and our donors.

Looking Back on 2018...

- 15 families and 52 children and youth were part of our community-integrated Village
- Rent subsidies and no fee therapeutic/program support for Village families
- 17 Caregivers received support through Caregiver Support Services
- 100% high school graduation rate of youth in the Village compared to 40% for BC youth in foster care
- 82 children participated in our After School Learning Clubs
- 57 children and youth received free therapeutic services
- 86 children attended camps, recreation, and cultural programs
- 19 explored the Sounds of Learning music program
- 57 youth supported by Youth Workers in the Transition to Adulthood Program

We also extended or piloted many other small projects:

- Indigenous artist Jay Havens worked with our kids over 9 weeks to create an amazing, culturally appropriate mural for the Village Centre
- Hummingbird Rising Consulting created a 6 week handaminam language class from our traditional territory
- Sprouting Chefs provided healthy cooking classes with wild foods and gardening expertise
- Fireside Adventures facilitated an incredible 21 day summer camp expedition
